Keynote Speaker

Ray Walser, Ph.D.

Professor of Practice

School of Diplomacy Washington, D.C. Program

Ray Walser is a retired Foreign Service Officer. Since Fall 2019, he has served as a Professor of Practice for the School of Diplomacy and International Relations' Washington Program. Walser entered the Department of State as a political officer in January 1980. Postings abroad were Managua, Bogota, Guadalajara, San Jose and Cape Town. In the Department, he worked in three bureaus — Western Hemisphere, European and African. From 2002-2003, he was special assistant to the Assistant Secretary for African Affairs. Walser's final assignment placed him in charge of Western Hemisphere Area Studies at the Foreign Service Institute. He was also detailed to the National Bipartisan Commission on Central America, and he served as a visiting professor in the Department of Social Sciences, United States Military Academy.

Upon retirement, Walser joined the Heritage Foundation, a leading Washington, D.C., think tank as a senior policy analyst for Latin America. While at Heritage, Walser testified before both Houses of Congress, published op-eds and other analytic pieces and appeared as an expert on CNN, Fox News, PBS and other media outlets. He also performed contract work on the issue of Violent Extremism in Latin America for the Joint Special Operations University in Tampa, Florida.

Walser grew up in Raleigh, North Carolina. He holds his undergraduate degree and a doctorate in European History from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Walser is married to Sandra Gutierrez of Nicaragua and has three children and four grandchildren.
